The "Crackerteria" is returning to Rugby's town centre for 4 weeks this Christmas. The fund raising café is opening its doors for business at 11am on Saturday (30th November) and can be found on Regent Street next to the "Hole in the Wall" shop. Run by youth charity Rugby Christmas Cracker, the café is raising money for the Bamejja street girls project in Kampala, Uganda. Bamejja (which means "little princesses") is a unique project providing care and support for the young women and girls who find themselves homeless, orphaned and living on the streets.

The popular pizzas and jacket potatoes remain on the menu, along with sumptuous salads, snacks, cakes, and fairly traded hot drinks. The Crackerteria will be open 10am to 6pm Monday to Saturday, and is being sponsored by "Flowers by Pauline".
